I currently hold a research fellow position in the Centre for Decision Research and Experimental Economics (CeDEx) at the University of Nottingham, as a member of an ERC funded project (“COOPERATION”), directed by Prof. Simon Gächter. Before joining CeDEx I was a research fellow as a member of the Strategic Interaction group at the Max Planck Institute of Economics in Jena, Germany, directed by Prof. Werner Güth. I received my PhD dissertation in social psychology from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, where I previously completed a master’s degree in cognitive science. I received my bachelor’s degree, in computer science and humanities, from Tel-Aviv University.

My work bridges social psychology and experimental economics. My main research interests are determinants of intra- and inter-group conflict and cooperation; unethical behaviour, in particular in collaborative settings; and cooperation and competition in social dilemmas, in particular under uncertainty.
